



## Harvest Home Programs

In order to support individuals seeking to engage in meaningful activities and relationships within their communities, SCARC provides two Harvest Home programs.

**Harvest Home Foods** enables individuals to participate in running food pantries which



serve over 900 Sussex County families each year who are experiencing food insecurity. Individuals pick up,

organize, package, and distribute or deliver perishable and nonperishable foods acquired through NORWESCAP and through private donations. This volunteer activity enables individuals to make an important contribution to their community while developing relationships with its members.

**Harvest Home Explorers** spend each day involved in a different community activity. Participants may engage in educational tours of local businesses and museums, enjoying or volunteering at our beautiful Sussex County parks, and visiting local nursing homes. Prevocational training is also offered to those individuals who would like to explore personal interests and goals.



Harvest Home Foods Pantries are located in both Hampton and Hamburg. Harvest Home Explorers are based in Hampton. Both programs are staffed by Day Habilitation Direct Support Professionals (DSPs). Transportation is available for attendees within the program's transportation catchment area.



### General Information

Harvest Home Foods and Harvest Home Explorers are two of SCARC's six day programs offering day habilitation, prevocational, and career planning services .

SCARC's services are certified and funded by the New Jersey Department of Human Services and the New Jersey Division of Developmental Disabilities.
