The **Eickmann Center**, located in Hampton, offers individuals community-based activities as well as the opportunity to build workplace skills. The Center's activities focus on sustainable gardening, including the



full spectrum of tasks from preparation for planting, through cultivation, to harvesting an organic, community garden.

Participants will also oversee a composting program and create garden accessories. The Eickmann Center offers experience and practical skill building for those considering pursuing competitive employment in addition to opportunities for socialization and community interaction.

Eickmann Explorers spend every day out and about in the community researching and considering general employment possibilities such as sustainable gardening, acquiring job skills through volunteering, and touring local businesses and farms.

The Eickmann programs are based at 4 Camre Drive in Newton, New Jersey, and are open Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 2:30 pm. Eickmann programs are staffed by Day Habilitation Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) at a ratio of one DSP to approximately 6 individuals. Transportation to the Eickmann Center is available for attendees within the Center's transportation catchment area.
